Pumps

Pumps are at the heart of every splash pad and must have the proper maintenance schedule. This may seem to be a large task but after your first time, the routine will be the same and will only take about 10 minutes.

Before you do anything, make sure your splash pad is not running. First, remove the clear top lid of the pump and clean out the strainer/basket. Once cleaned, replace the strainer/basket and tighten the lid back on. Next, you will check the O-ring, lube around the O-ring and check the seal as well. Lastly, check the pump for any leaks.

Should your pump be leaking, call your local Hayward Rep for help concerning your pump. If they are unable to assist you please give us a call and we will help you.

Filters

Part of the splash pad equipment is the filter. This will filter out the larger particles on your splash pad. This is just as easy to maintain as your pump. Shut off the pump before starting this process. Every two weeks or so, be sure to clean your cartridge filter by loosening the ring around the filter, opening the lid and removing the filters.

Once the filters are out of the cartridge, use a hose with pressure to spray them off. Be sure that the filters are completely clean before you place them back into the cartridge.

After they are clean, place back into the cartridge, replace the lid, tighten the ring, close the drains and start the system back up.

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Chemistry

Using the right chemicals for your splash pad is going to be important. It will help keep your water clean and make it safe for kids to play in. The testing process is every simple just like the other parts of quipment for your splash pad. You will need to purchase some chlorine test strips to test the water with, which can be found at any pool supply store.

Follow the instructions on the test strip and you are good to go. If you need to purchase more chlorine for your splash pad, it can be found at the pool supply business as well.

Start Up Instructions

- 0 Clean your splash pad with a broom.
- 0 Clean out your drains.
- 0 Remove or change the nozzles from winterization.
- 0 Inspect all nozzles, bolts, equipment and features.
- 0 Install nozzles and water features if they were previously removed for winterizing.
- 0 Turn water on to water tank and allow it to fill.
- 0 Open all ball valves to the correct position.
- 0 Tighten any unions you may have near the equipment.
- 0 Fill pump basket with water until completely full.
- 0 Turn on main breaker for the control box and pumps.
- 0 Turn on filter pump and prime. Check for leaks.
- 0 Turn on feature pump and prime. Check for leaks.
- 0 Adjust ball valves as needed for nozzle and feature water flow.
- 0 Start up and enjoy!

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Weekly

Run your splash pad at least once a week for one hour. Make sure it runs long enough to have the water circulate at least twice through the whole system.

Check the chemicals and do a visual inspection of all splash pad equipment and parts.

Monthly

Clean the filters even if the pad is not used.

Check chlorination and add tablets if needed.

Check the quality of the water in your tank.

Check drains and pumps and clean as needed.



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
